

# SHILLONG COMMERCE COLLEGE ANNUAL REPORT JULY 2023- JUNE 2024

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#### PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

The College was started in June 1964 under the name Commerce College, Shillong, as a purely private college in G. S. Road, Shillong. It was shifted to the present land and building on 1st May 1967. Temporary affiliation was granted by the Guwahati University up to B.Com (Pass Course) in 1967.

The College was closed down by the Governing Body from 1st April 1977 due to mis-management by the College Authorities, and was de-affiliated by NEHU. The services of the Principal, Teaching Staff and Office Staff were also terminated by the Governing Body.

The management of the college was taken over by the Government of Meghalaya by an Act of 1984 adopted by the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly and duly assented by the President of India on 17th November 1984.

The college was re-opened from 28th May 1986 as Shillong Commerce College, with PU Commerce classes (Class XI and XII) in the same land and building duly improved, renovated and repaired after permission for reopening was granted by NEHU authorities. Initially provisional affiliation was granted for 3 years only by the University for PU Commerce from 11th September 1987. However, the college is affiliated to the North Eastern Hill University for under graduate, B.Com (Hons.) classes. The college is now recognized by the UGC under 2F in January 1989 and under 12B in June 2003.

In the beginning the college started with a full time Principal who came on deputation from the Government of Meghalaya, 7 full time lecturers and 6 full time office staff with a strength of only 120 students for the session 1987-88. Now the college has 25 full time lecturers and 15 office staff with strength of 1150 students: 748 Degree students & 402 Higher Secondary for the session 2015-2016.

In a very short span of time the college has been able to produce students who have done remarkably well in their lives. Yet the college still needs to achieve more in terms of quality education. In this respect it is felt that the process of Assessment and Accreditation is a great opportunity to go beyond our daily routine and get involved in the extremely satisfying process of overhauling and self learning. It is hoped that something good would definitely emerge out of the assessment, which would thus create a better academic climate in the college.

The College has grown in terms of number of faculty members, students, co-curricular and extracurricular programs. We are open to students of all communities. A large proportion of our students are first generation learners in the arena of higher education. We strive tirelessly to upgrade skills and knowledge, impart values and guide our students to take their place as responsible citizens of India.

The College strives to provide holistic education to the students. The Self Study Report is a culmination of our efforts and we look forward to a rewarding interaction with the NAAC Peer Team to accredit our institution.

Vision of Shillong Commerce college is to be an accessible, responsive and inclusive college delivering excellent programmes of teaching and outreach that improve the lives and opportunities of students - primarily for the economically disadvantaged- of the state and the region as a whole.

#### 2. CONVERSATIONAL HINDI 2023- 24

The Conversational Hindi Training Program was organised in Shillong Commerce College from 16th August to 16th October 2023, in collaboration with Bharatiya Bhasha Manch, Meghalaya Prant with an aim to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the Hindi language and its significance.

#### Objectives:

- To develop basic proficiency in speaking, reading and writing Hindi.
- To familiarise students with Hindi Grammar, Vocabulary and Sentence structure.
- To enhance cultural awareness and appreciation of Hindi language through speech.
- To facilitate effective communication in Hindi for academic and professional purposes.

#### Course Contents:

The curriculum was designed to progressively cover various aspects of the language, starting from basic greetings and introduction to more complex topics such as sentence formation and comprehension.

- Introduction to Hindi script ( Devanagiri), pronunciation and basic vocabulary.
- Grammar fundamentals including noun, gender, verb and sentence structure.
- Expansion of vocabulary through the matic units such as family, food, travel, etc.
- Practical application through test and exams.
- Review sessions and assessment of Hindi through speech test.

The duration of the course was 30 contact hours of intensive instruction with classes held 5 days a week for one hour each session.

#### Assessment:

Assessment methods included ORAL PRESENTATION and a WRITTEN EXAMINATION. These assessments evaluated students' proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing Hindi as well as their understanding of grammatical concepts.

Enrolment: The total number of students enrolled for the program was 67 out of which 27 students successfully completed the course and were awarded certificates as proof of their completion of the cours

# FIELD TRIP AND STUDY TOUR INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO UMIAM INDUSTRIAL ESTATE UMIAM, MEGHALAYA

The Department of Commerce, Shillong Commerce College organised an industrial visit to the Umiam Industrial Area at Umiam, Meghalaya on the 20th of May, 2024. A contingent of 160 students of the B.Com 6th semester along with Prof. A. M. Rynjah, Prof. W. Dkhar, Prof. B. D. Nongkhlaw, Prof. K. Agarwal, Prof. M. Wankhar, Prof. P. Marbaniang, Prof. P. C. Marwein, Prof. I. Nongkhlaw and Prof. R. Chyne undertook the trip. The journey started at around 8 a.m from the college to the desired destination at Umiam which is approximately 16.8 kms from Shillong. On reaching Umiam, the group met Mr. K. S. Mawlieh of Meghalaya Industrial Development Corporation (MIDC) who was deputed as the Coordinator for the visit. The purpose of the visit was to give the students a real life exposure to the functioning of industrial units so that they get a better perspective through the observation of the manufacturing processes and industrial operations. The opportunity to visit several factories viz., MK Enterprise Briquette, Meghalaya Roofing, SPS Industries, Rapsang Group of Industries, SRM Plasto, Pine Polly Pack Mineral Water, Meghalaya Polymers, Meghalaya Plywood Industries, Timbre Craft and Grirk Briquettes has been a great learning experience for the students. Each plant engaged a technical person to guide and facilitate the students' queries. The interactions with the factory's executives and staffs helped them gain important knowledge about the steps and processes involved in the manufacturing of the different

The Ever Living Museum is a unique institution that brings history to life through interactive exhibits and immersive experiences showcasing the rich culture and tradition of North East India with a focus on Meghalaya. The trip provided students with a deeper understanding of the rich material culture of the Khasi, Jaintia and Garo communities as well as fostered a sense of appreciation for the past. The walk was led by Mr. Kyntiewbor War, the owner and curator of the Museum, where students embarked on a journey through time, exploring the three components of the Museum – The Heritage Section, the Stone Museum and the Garden. The artefacts in the Heritage section comprised weapons, pottery, Mughal and British coins, religious objects and everyday utilities of the people of Meghalaya. The Stone Museum is comprised of fossils, stone tools, religious stones and precious and semi-precious stones of Meghalaya (the only museum of its kind in North-East India). The garden was full of indigenous plants and flowers rooted in Khasi-Jaintia folklore and medicine.

The field trip to the Ever Living Museum was a resounding success, providing students with a memorable and educational experience. By immersing themselves in the sights, sounds, and stories of the past, students gained a newfound appreciation for the richness and diversity of human history. The interactive nature of the exhibits, combined with live demonstrations and educational workshops, made for a truly engaging and enlightening experience. As students returned to school, they carried with them not only a deeper understanding of history but also a sense of curiosity and wonder that will inspire further exploration and learning.

#### REPORT ON EDUCATIONAL TOUR TO SACRED GROVE, MAWPHLANG

Mawphlang is a block in East Khasi Hills District of the State of Meghalaya, India. It is situated in the South-West of Shillong at a distance of about 24 kms. Khasi society is one of the major tribes in the State of Meghalaya, having their own traditional institutions and their own administrations. Hima Mawphlang is made up of 23 *Shnong* (Villages) and is presided over by the *Lyngdoh* (Priest Chief) with the *Myntri(s)* or Ministers. The Lyngdoh is elected from the Lyngdoh clan by the population of male adults' citizen of the Hima Mawphlang.

The region has an attractive tourist destination. The renowned sacred forest of Meghalaya is located in Mawphlang. The Mawphlang Sacred Grove (Law Kyntang) is a remarkable forest which reveals an astonishing network of plants and trees. The word 'Maw' means 'Stone' and 'Phlang' stands for grass; literally translating it as 'grassy stones'. The Sacred Grove has been maintained for centuries.

According to the belief of the local people, nothing is allowed to be removed from the forest as it may upset the sylvan deities. This is what makes it sacred.



At the start of the session, the speaker raised several pertinent questions such as: Why entrepreneurship? What does it take to build a profitable and sustainable venture? He went on to expound on the different entrepreneurship traits that are often exhibited by successful entrepreneurs such hard work, determination and innovativeness by sharing real life examples such as the stories of Wilma Rudolf an Olympic athlete, Abraham Lincoln the greatest politician of all times and Bharat Jain's journey from humble beginnings to becoming a wealthy beggar. He dwelt at length on how to search for a viable product for a place like Meghalaya. He also discussed about the various schemes launched by the State Government for the promotion of entrepreneurship and the tourism industry in Meghalaya. The session concluded with a question and answer round where the participants were given an opportunity to clear their doubts which was followed by the vote of thanks by the Head of the Department.

He talked about various activities under Systematic Voters' Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP) Programme. He also discussed about the procedures relating to registration of name in Electoral Roll, correction of their existing particulars in Electoral Roll and deletion of name of shifted and deceased family members. There was also a short discussion and interaction between the attendees and the resource person after the talk.





### **OTHER ACTIVITIES**

#### **SUMMARY REPORT ON MENTORING 2023**

During this academic year 2023, mentoring sessions were started in the month of April. All mentors kept a confidential data sheet about their students, mentor's assessment of students which records a report of mentoring done by the teachers. The mentors through interactions with their mentees, identified the academic, socio- economic status issues and psychological needs of the mentees. They also informed the students about the support system available in the college such as remedial coaching classes and counselling service.

Some of the issues raised during mentoring sessions are:

- Poor academic performance
- Inadequate number of hours spent in studies
- Concerns about sleep deprivation due to uncontrolled screen time.
- Lack of reading habit among the mentees
- Health issues, vision problems and eye diseases
- Family problems, financial problems (most mentees were engaged in a part time job
- either to support their families or to support their own education. This is one big
- factor affecting their dedication to studies).
- Majority of the mentees are into smoking habit.
- Discussions on selecting honours subject, time management and career options.
- Most mentees did their assignments in the last minute. Some did their assignments
- during their free time.
- Some students dropped out from the college during 2nd semester and 4th semester.
- Some mentees through interactions expressed their interest to pursue higher studies

after their graduation. While some of them seem unsure of what they wish to pursue.

Still another set of mentees have decided to pursue other avenues other than academics.

- Mentees raised their issues faced by them inside the campus such as the lack of proper
- boy's common room and boy's wash room, lack of projectors in some classrooms and
- water scarcity.
- Most mentees from morning section, faced issues like language barrier, adjustment
- problems, low self- esteem and expressed their loss of interest in studies.
- Some mentees expressed having problems with the class timings as in some days they
- had many off periods.
- Some suggested that more books should be made available in the college library.
- One issue during mentoring session was that one mentee communicated his migraine
- significantly affecting his studies for which he was asked to seek medical attention in
- the college medical room.
- Some mentees despite calling them for mentoring sessions refused to respond and
- some filled up the mentoring forms and submitted but never attended mentoring
- sessions.

- Issues resolved during mentoring sessions:
- Mentors advised their mentees to work hard and invest at least 8 hours a day daily in
- their studies.
- They also suggested to spend at least 2-3 hours every day in the library and to make
- optimum use of the library facilities.
- The mentees were counselled to lead a healthy lifestyle through proper diet, exercise,
- adequate sleep and reduce screen time.
- Mentees were taught about moral values and ethics.
- General guidance was given on how to prepare for the upcoming examination.
- They were also encouraged never to give up on anything in life.
- Mentees were also encouraged to solve previous years question papers.
- Mentees were sent to the college counsellor for mental, emotional and moral support.
- Advice has been given to focus on regular reading for language improvement.
- For mentees who are in their 2nd and 4th semesters, there will be more opportunities to
- mentor them before their graduation.
- Some genuine problems within the campus (e.g. lack of proper boy's common room
- and boy's wash room, lack of projectors in some classrooms and water scarcity) had
- been discussed with mentees. The mentees were made aware that their problems were
- being addressed and improvements were being made.
- Most students have mentioned that they were comfortable to talk to their teachers and
- a few with their own classmates or senior students and a few with the college
- counsellor.

In conclusion, inspite of time constraints mentoring sessions were conducted effectively. Mentees were encouraged by their mentors to feel free to contact them whenever they have any issues regarding academics. The mentoring sessions showed that students needed constant support, proper guidance and encouragement both from the teachers and also from their parents.

# REPORT ON LIBRARY TRAINING SESSION ON THEME-"BEYOND BOOKS" WITH J-GATE

A one day Library Training Program on the theme "Beyond Books" with J-Gate was organized in Shillong Commerce College by Shillong Commerce College Library In collaboration with Informatics Publishing Limited, Bangalore On 9th August 2023 at 11 AM in which the guest speaker for the training session was Mr. Mahendranath Sarkar from Informatics Publishing Limited, Bangalore. He looks after the research and development in Informatics Publishing Limited. The training program gave an introduction about J-Gate and how it is the world's largest database of journal articles indexing metadata of over 51 million journal articles in multidisciplinary domains updated daily. He then laid out the Dos and Don'ts while searching articles through this database and explained to the users how they can search articles using the basic search which search through all items available like journal articles, Thesis, Book Series, Conference proceedings and audio/video or users can use the advance search in which users can specify on the type of item required using search methods like the and/or Boolean search for optimum results. After the search results users can also use the refine search to select for example specified authors from the list of authors given related with the search documents. Citation index is also indicated for the users reference. The Users can filter results by category, subject, author, journal, ranking, source index, year, country of publication or publishers. Options for saving articles, citation, email, taking print out or downloading articles is also available. The speaker then went on to explained to users on how they can find their favourites, search history and saved items from the personalization tab. He then inform the users that online access to J-Gate can be done after the users has submitted their details and email ids to College Library after which the college admin will register each user and individual credentials will be sent to access their J-Gate membership.





#### **BOOK FAIR**

A two day book fair Fiesta with the theme "Books are tickets to other worlds" was organized by Shillong Commerce College Library in collaboration with Shillong College Central Library and College of Teacher Education (PGT) Library, Shillong on the 9th and 10th October 2023 in the College Auditorium of Shillong Commerce College.

The fair took place with the active participation of six well known book agencies and publishers from Shillong and Guwahati displaying variety of books in different genre ranging from textbooks, reference books, religious books, children story books, fictions and non fictions etc. This Book Fair aimed at providing a wide variety of books and publications putting the very best books directly into the faculties and students' hand with special emphasis on books focusing on the new NEP 2020 syllabus.
